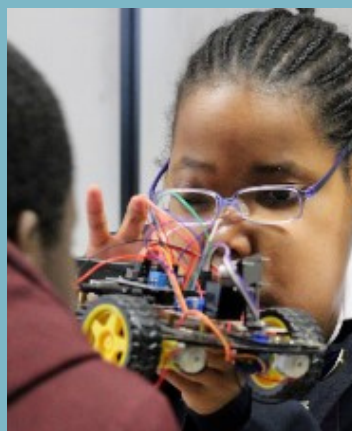
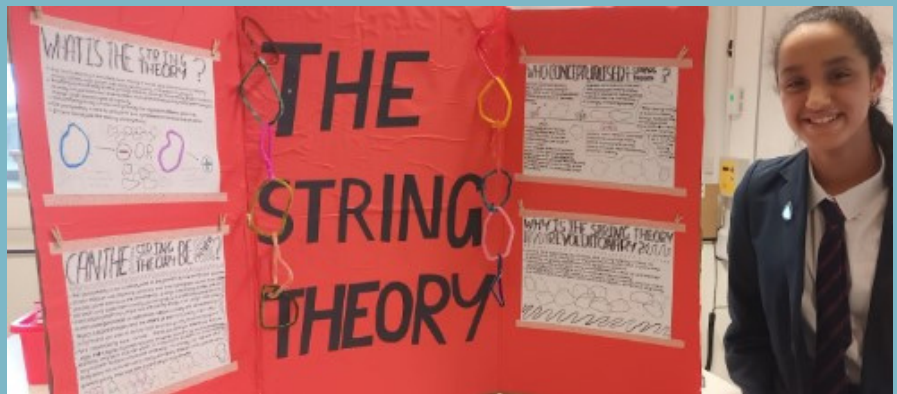


SCIENCE FAIR 2023

UNDERSTANDING FINANCES

1 Understanding school finances

Trips and visits are so important to your child's development. They enhance their experience of school. They help them to see the wider world and perhaps more importantly, they are fun, create lasting memories and build friendships for life.

11th in the country!

We submit balanced budgets, spend income thoughtfully and innovate where possible to create efficiencies in a fundamentally inefficient system, for example by creating the [Reach Children's Hub](#).

Our outcomes are in the top 10% nationally across all measures from Early Years to A Levels and 100% of our pupils in Y13 last year has a place at university or on a high tariff apprenticeship.

Of all schools in England in 2022 with pupil deprivation above 40% and no entrance selection criteria based on religion, Reach Academy's Progress 8 score ranked us 11th in the country.

Over the past 10 years we have significantly subsidised the cost of activities, educational resources and essentials such as costs of food and school uniform in order to ensure that every single one of our pupils is able to enjoy a life of choice and opportunity during their school years and, crucially, in their adult lives.

We get funding per pupil and have not received additional money to cover these costs.

We are, sadly, not in a position to subsidise costs as easily as we have done in the past because of rising expenses out of our control. But we still don't want your children to miss out. That is why we need some help...

What can you do?

- Please pay for trips.** Schools have to legally say that some parts of payments are 'voluntary'. In reality, if we don't get enough families paying then trips can't go ahead. Many schools just tell parents that all costs are compulsory, we don't, but please pay if you can.
- Please also pay for your lunches.** You can pay in advance to avoid getting into arrears.
- If you can't pay some or all of the cost please speak to us as early as possible and we will make a plan. We do not want your child to miss out. **We will find a way together.**

We will continue to manage things well and seek opportunities for funding and other resources.

We will also continue to support you and provide an outstanding education to your children.

We are here to work together for the very best outcomes for your children.

2 Do you wish to help a family?

If you can contribute more than the cost of your child's lunches or trips, then please do.

To make it easy for you to help if you would like to everyone will soon be able to see two additional payments on their Parent Pay account.

These are entirely optional, but any contribution will help other families.

There is no pressure or judgment either way.

- You will see an option to make a voluntary contribution for another child to attend a residential. You can contribute between £1 and £250.
- You will see an option to make a voluntary contribution for another child's lunches. You can contribute between £1 and £450.

Anything you can give will help a family.

YEAR 1

As we wrap up the Spring term, Year 1 has had a term filled with fun learning. We recently enjoyed World Book Day in the first week in March and evoked a passion for reading for pleasure. We also had an amazing trip to the Natural History Museum last week, where children met Sophie the stegosaurus and enjoyed a workshop all about dinosaur features.

In DT, children enjoyed learning about windmill structures and even created their own windmills. Pupils were even able to test them outside in the wind. It was amazing to see pupils' passion for building structures and their creativity when designing their windmills. At home, you can ask your children what the three main features of a windmill are.



YEAR 2

It's been a wonderful end to the term for our Year 2s. The children performed admirably in their parent celebration event. They were so excited to share their learning from this term. Thank you to all of you who came!

On Monday, 27th March, we took part in Team Reach Day - Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds. On this day, we discussed the topic of mental health; what it is and why it's so important to look after it. Throughout the day, we took part in a range of activities (including a mini-marathon with Year 7s!) designed to expand the children's knowledge of the subject. The children also learnt strategies they can use in order to ensure that they maintain positive mental health.

In writing, we have planned and written our recounts of our trip to the Natural History Museum.

In Maths, we continued to explore different strategies we can use to find the missing number in an addition/subtraction equation. We then moved onto our unit on 2-D/3-D shapes. We began by revising the properties of 2-D shapes, including the number of sides, vertices, right angles and lines of symmetry. We then looked at how we could describe 3-D shapes based on their different properties.

In Science, we finished up our unit on Space by researching space exploration, looking at how humans have sought to expand their knowledge of the universe. We learnt that in 1961, Yuri Gagarin became the first man in space, soon followed by Valentina Tereshkova - the first woman in space!



In Geography, we learnt that earthquakes happen when tectonic plates converge against each other with such force that they can cause immense damage and destruction. We looked at the Tohoku Earthquake in Japan in 2011 as a case study. We finished by studying the effects of volcanic eruptions.



To help our students, we have set them maths/reading homework to be completed over the holidays. This should take around 10 minutes per day. Please ensure that your children complete this.

YEAR 3

On Monday 27th March, Year 3 took part in Team Reach Day - Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds. They focused on the topic of mental health; what it is and why it is so important to look after it.

Throughout the day, we took part in a range of different activities. These activities were all strategies that the children can use, now and in the future, to ensure that they have a positive mental health. These activities included running a mini-marathon with Year 9, mindfulness (breathing, colouring and listening) as well as bilateral drawing. Bilateral drawing is using both hands to make marks on a piece of paper with your eyes closed. By moving both hands at the same time, your mind and body can become present in the moment, which helps relieve stress and anxiety. We even got to make our very own fruit smoothies, as we know that a healthy diet means a healthy mind! Below are some photos of the Year 3 team participating actively throughout the day.

Linked to Healthy Bodies and Healthy Minds, Year 3 were lucky enough to partake in an inter-year PE competition. Beech took on Birch in the ultimate PE challenge. There were 10 stations that children rotated around and battled it out to be the PE champions. Stations included relay races, step ups, bean-bag throwing and even the plank! There were so many sporting stars that shone through. All the staff were amazed at the endeavour and courage shown by the Year 3 team. In the end, Beech Class were victorious. Congratulations to them!

On Monday 15th May, Year 3 will be partaking in a Times Tables competition against Y4, 5 and 6. Children will have 60 times tables questions that they will have to answer as quickly as possible. The children, who finish in the top 3, will qualify for the Reach Academy times tables finals! It would be amazing to see as many Year 3 teammates as possible excelling in this competition so do encourage them to practise those times tables at home.

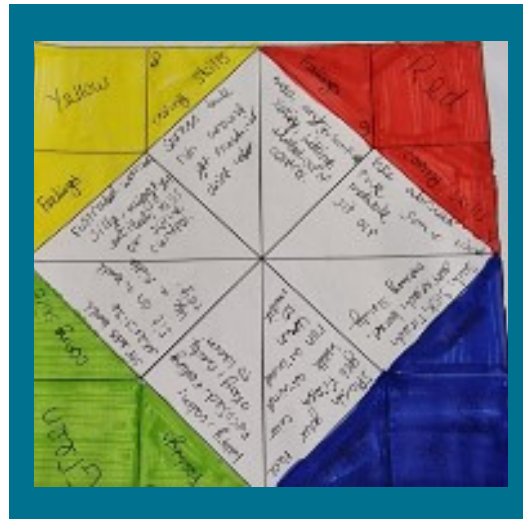

YEAR 4

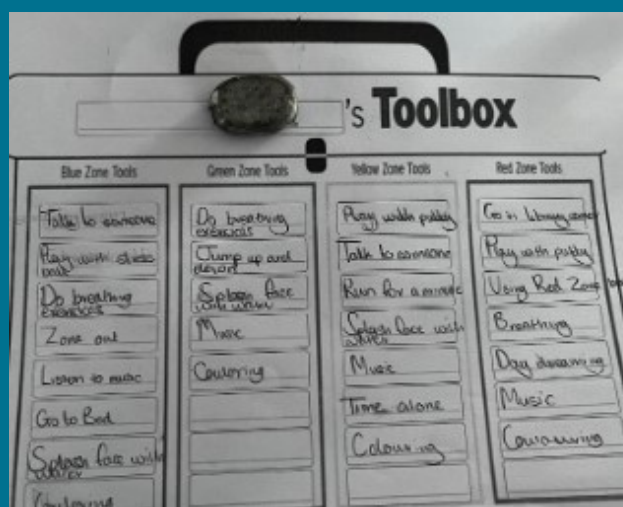
Year 4 had an amazing Teach Reach day this week. We looked at how to manage our emotions and stressors through using different strategies such as Mindful colouring, Music, Yoga and creating a toolbox for the different zones of regulation.

A highlight for the children was the healthy eating workshop, smoothie making. The children selected their ingredients as a group, chopped them up and blended them into amazingly tasty smoothies or juices.



YEAR 5

This week, the children had their Team Reach day, which revolved around physical and mental health. The children had so much fun exploring what helps them when they're in the different zones of regulation and creating their own tool kits to help them manage their different emotions. Additionally, they loved learning about how to keep a healthy body and ran a mini marathon, as well as making their own fruit smoothies in groups, which were all so delicious.



This term in DT, the children have been creating their own stuffed toy, using a blanket stitch. They have worked so hard to think carefully about their design, then how best to sew and stuff it and then create it. We are so proud of their final products and they had so much fun in creating them!



YEAR 6

On Monday 27th March, Year 6 pupils participated in our Team Reach Day 'Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds'. Pupils began the day exploring positive mental health. They then learned about how our mental and physical health are inextricably linked. Pupils explored what self-regulation means and re-visited the Zones of Regulation.

In the bilateral drawing session, pupils learned how to take a moment to focus on all their thoughts and feelings and help their brain and body work as one. This mindfulness session was really relaxing and lots of pupils added it to their mental health toolbox.



In the morning, pupils also took part in a mini-marathon where they ran a mile around the playground. Congratulations to Lucas and Preston in Team Tyne who ran 27 laps of the primary playground and Kenzie in 6 Don who ran a whopping 45 laps of the Sports Hall!

We also loved making our own smoothies in the Food Technology room with Amelia, Michelle and Sandra. Using carrots, avocados, apples, mixed berries, orange juice and bananas, pupils made a variety of delicious smoothies in the blender. Everyone enjoyed tasting each other's creations and working together as a team.

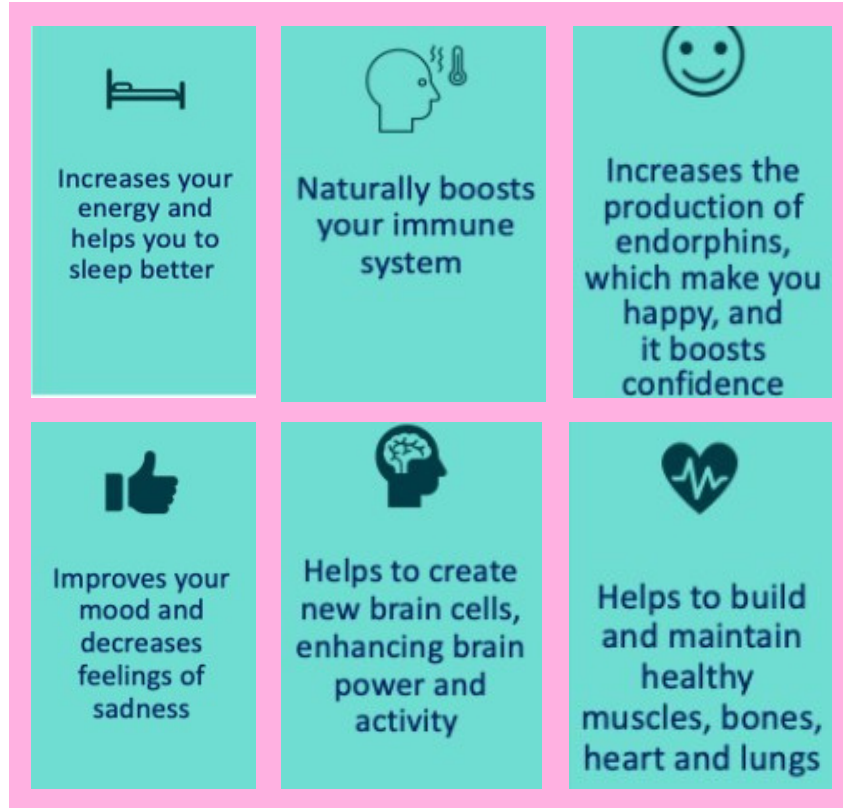
Highlight this week.....Healthy minds Healthy bodies day!

Cycle 3 topics

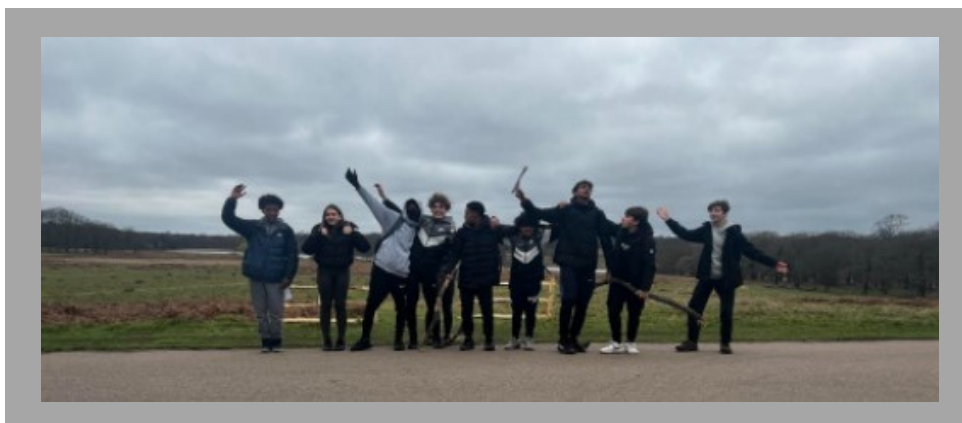

Film review: 'Shazam, Fury of the Gods' by Christopher Barnes.

'Shazam, Fury of the Gods' is the best movie that DC has ever filmed. Released in 2023, it starred Zachary Levi (Shazam) and Asher Angel (Billy Batson). Shazam stands for the wisdom of Solomon, the strength of Hercules, the stamina of Atlas, the power of Zeus, the courage of Achilles and the speed of Mercury (SHAZAM!). The box office to make Shazam in the US is \$101.7 million dollars while in the UK it made £82.61 million.

The plot of the movie is that Billy and his fellow foster kids are still learning how to juggle teenage life. One of the foster kids is gay. But when a vengeful trio of ancient gods arrives on Earth searching for the stolen magic from them a long time ago, Shazam and his allies get thrust into the battle of superpowers, their lives, and the world. Also Wonder Woman is in the movie near the end of the movie.

It was really awesome and I would recommend this movie to any DC fans because of Wonder Woman being in it near the end of the movie. I would give this movie 4 and a half stars because it could have been better such as having more hand to hand combat rather than using lightning. Also it should have had the new Black Adam and Shazam meeting with each other at the end credits and it would make it like a rivalry like in the comics, just like when Superman did at the end credits of Black Adam.

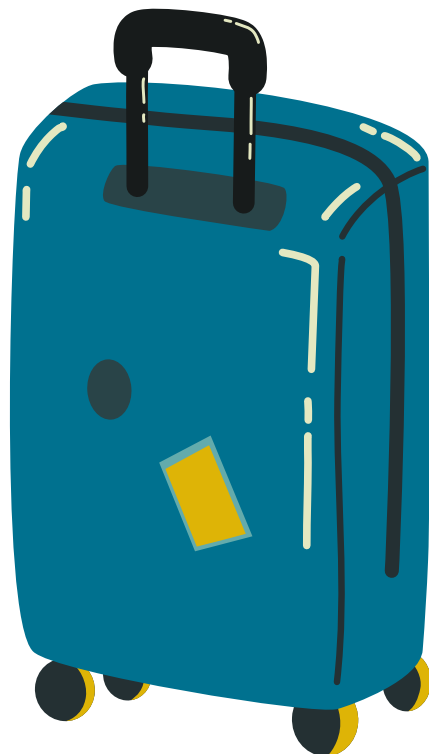

SIXTH FORM

As we bring the term to a close there has been a wide range of excellent events and achievements to celebrate over the past few weeks. The most important thing to recognise at this time though is the incredible endeavour that students are showing at one of the most critical times of the academic year. Year 13 students have been juggling university interviews and completing coursework all whilst preparing for their final exams which are mere months away. The incredible endeavour displayed by our pupils is reflected in the incredibly exciting that pupils continue to receive. Pupils at Feltham College have received university offers from institutions such as LSE, UCL, Kings College, and Durham University for a wide range of courses.

Year 12 have returned to their studies this week after a week off-timetable for Destinations Week. Pupils visited a range of different universities including UCL, Southampton, Cambridge and St Mary's to experience lectures and speak with student ambassadors. On Friday were introduced to Unifrog a web-based platform that provides unbiased careers information and advice to young people to help them make informed decisions about what to do after school. In the afternoon every student in Y12 was given the opportunity to do a practice interview in which they were asked the following questions:

Update from Hounslow LA: Measles cases

There have been a small number of measles cases amongst children in Hounslow and neighbouring North-west London boroughs over the last few weeks.

Measles is highly infectious and spreads very easily. The typical symptoms that someone who has measles might show are a cough, runny nose, a rash, sore red watery eyes and a fever. In some cases, the complications of measles can lead to ear infection, chest infection, diarrhoea, can cause fits, and more serious complications of brain infection and risk of death. Anyone who hasn't had two doses of the MMR vaccine is susceptible to catching measles. The risk of more serious complications is increased for those people who are unvaccinated, particularly those who have health conditions that affect the immune systems and for pregnant women.

The best protection against measles for any child or adult is vaccination; two doses of MMR are required for protection.

We are asking our schools to widen our communication with families. The message is to advise parents of children of any age to check whether their child's vaccinations, especially MMR are up to date. Parents and carers who are unsure whether their child is protected against measles can check in their child's Red Book, or contact their GP surgery. If a child has missed one or both doses of the MMR vaccine we urge parents to make an appointment with their GP for their child to get up to date with their vaccinations. We would also urge parents and carers who think their child has measles to not send their child to school and contact their GP for advice.

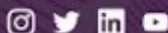

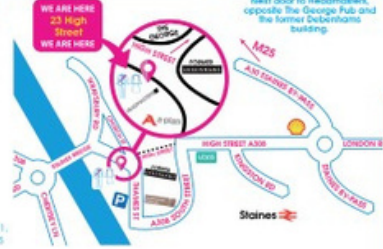

Young carers are children and young people who look after someone in their family who has an illness, a disability, or is affected by mental ill-health or substance misuse. They will often carry out caring responsibilities usually undertaken by adults, including household chores, physical help, administering medication, shopping, paying bills, providing sibling care or providing emotional support.

The project provides information and advice, fun activities in school holidays, weekly youth clubs, specialist workshops and one to one support. It is also a chance for the young carers to have a break from their caring role and to meet other young carers who are in a similar situation. We aim to make each club a place where young carers can have fun and support each other in a safe environment.

Statutory and Voluntary referrals can be made to the project. Self-Referrals made by the family are also encouraged.
