We are so proud of them for all the hard work they have put into learning their times tables.

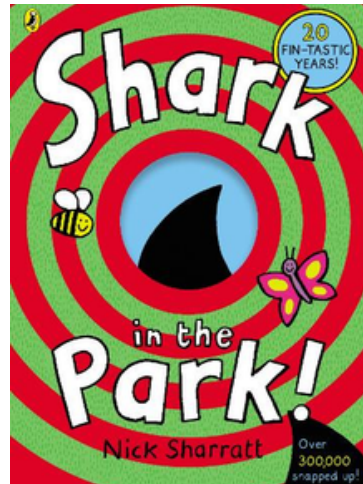
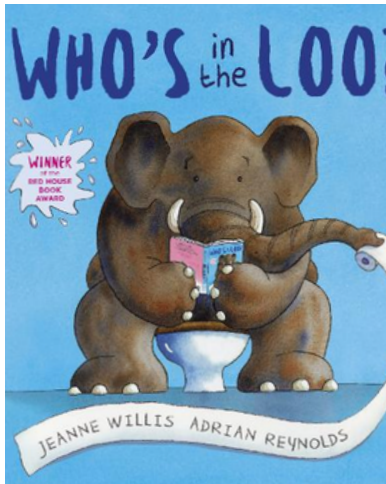

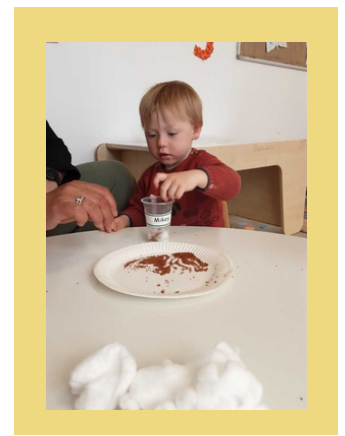
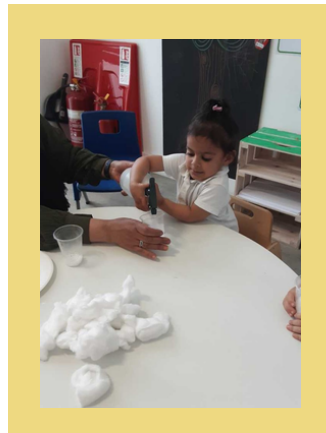
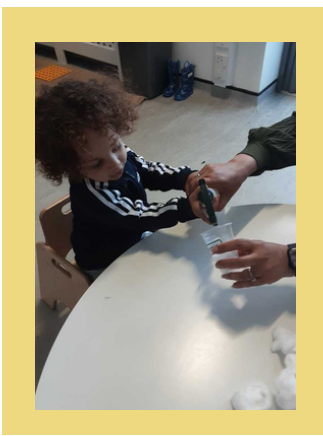
PHASE 2 DISCO

NURSERY

This week in nursery, the Seedlings have been busy planting cress seeds. The children followed instructions on how to put the cotton wool in first, spray it with water and sprinkle the seeds on top. We talked about how seeds need water to grow, the children have taken it in turns to water the seeds each day.



NURSERY

This week, the Saplings have been learning about growing sunflower seeds. First, they labelled their pots by writing their name and filled it with soil. They listened and followed instructions on putting 2 seeds in their pots, then watered them. The children have learnt to take care of the seeds by watering them and placing them in the sunshine. If your children have fun at home with planting, please take photos and share the with us on Tapestry.



RECEPTION

Reception have been getting creative outside in the warmer weather. They have tested their balancing skills by building slides, obstacle courses and see-saws using planks of wood. They also opened their own bug hotel this week with a variety of minibeasts including slugs, spiders, worms and centipedes. Each mini beast was named after a member of either Chestnut or Magnolia class and the children came back every day to check whether the bugs were still there. They took care of the bugs by making sure they had old leaves to eat and enough soil and bark to hide in.



In maths, we have been learning about money and the value of 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p coins. The children have been paying for items costing up to 15p and giving change for items costing up to 10p using a combination of coins. They have used counters on a 10 frame to represent the value of each coin. This supports their understanding of the value of different coins by allowing them to visualise the whole amount. To extend their learning at home, you could set up a play shop in your house selling toys costing up to 15p, or ask your child to pay for their snack each day using real coins.

YEAR 1

This half term, Year 1 has been having great fun in Computing, DT and Maths. In DT we have been looking at food and nutrition and pupils even made fruit and vegetable smoothies! We have been learning about where certain fruits and vegetables grow and whether they are grown from trees, underground, overground or from vines. At home, you can ask your child which fruit grows on vines.

In computing, we have also been looking at data. Pupils have been using chrome books to represent data in a variety of ways. One way we have been representing data is through graphs. Pupils used pictograms to make bar graphs, line graphs and pie charts.

For the past week we have been learning about money in Maths. Pupils began by learning how to identify coins by looking at their physical properties. Ask your children how we can identify a 2p coin through looking at its physical properties. We then moved on to adding different coins to calculate the total value. Pupils had great fun playing shopkeepers with their partners and adding up items from the list and buying them from the shopkeeper.



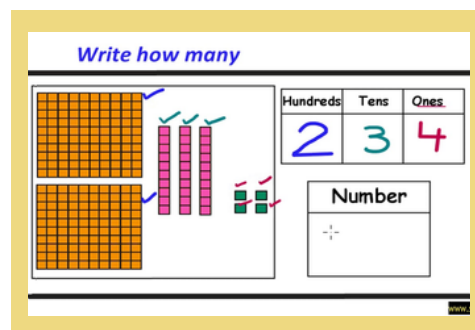
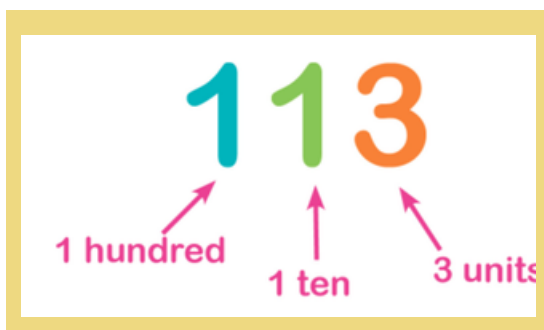
YEAR 2

In Year 2, we have wrapped up the SATS assessment period. The children have sat 2 reading and 2 maths papers in total and have really shown all of the Reach values to achieve the best results possible. We are so proud of them. Well done to all of you!

In Maths, we finished up our unit on standard units, learning how to estimate in litres and millilitres.



We then moved onto exploring the value of the digits in 3-digit numbers, representing these using dienes as well as pictorially.



YEAR 2 Continued...

In writing, we have been writing instructions on how to fly to space and how to climb a volcano. We have learnt that instructions usually have a hook near the start to grab the reader's attention. To be successful with this, we used lots of exciting adjectives and structured our hook as a rhetorical question. We are currently writing the steps which include writing fronted adverbials and verbs in the present tense.

In PE, we have continued to refine our tennis skills. We are now able to control a tennis ball with a racket with a fair amount of confidence. Some of us have begun to play mini tennis matches. How exciting!

In Science, we learned about germs and how these can make you sick. We learned about Florence Nightingale and how as a nurse, she worked to improve our understanding of hygiene and make places like hospitals much cleaner.

In history, we finished up our unit on Ancient Egypt. We looked at Ancient Egyptian religion, exploring the different beliefs and Gods. We then learnt about Egypt's most famous pharaohs, including King Narmer, Egypt's first pharaoh, the boy king Tutankhamun, to the last, Cleopatra.

YEAR 3

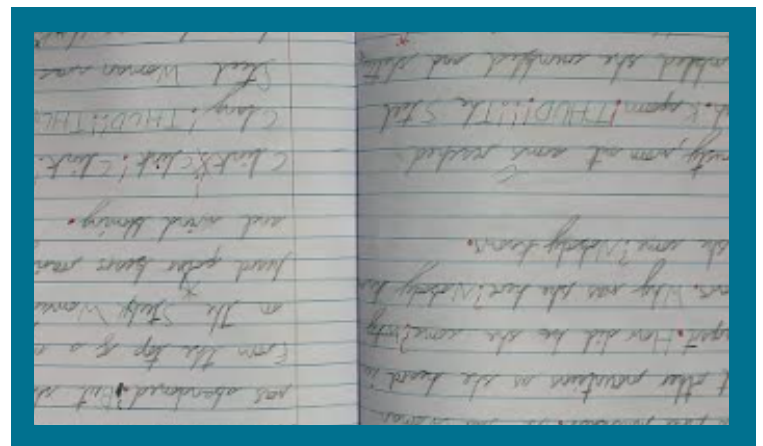
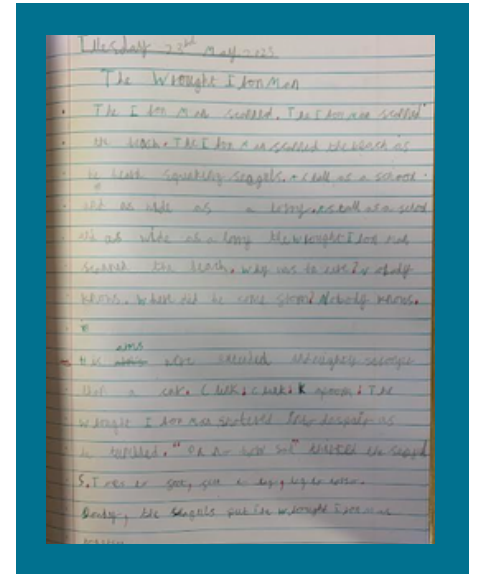


YEAR 3 Continued...

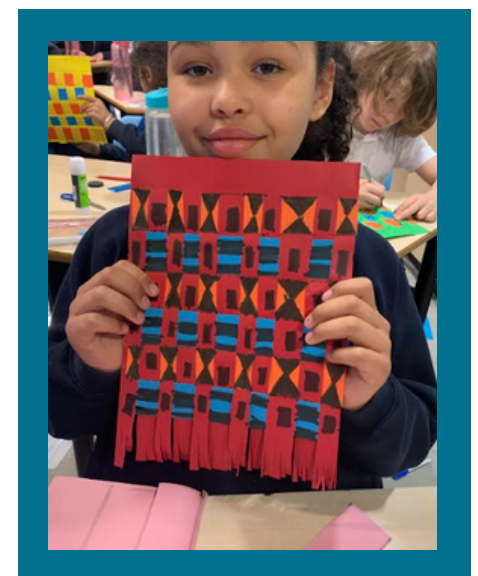
- Repetition

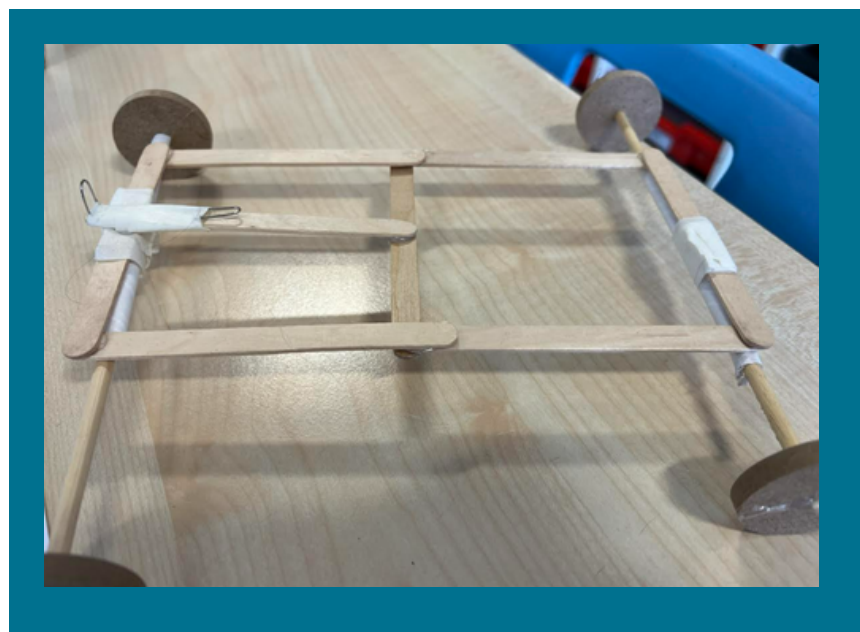
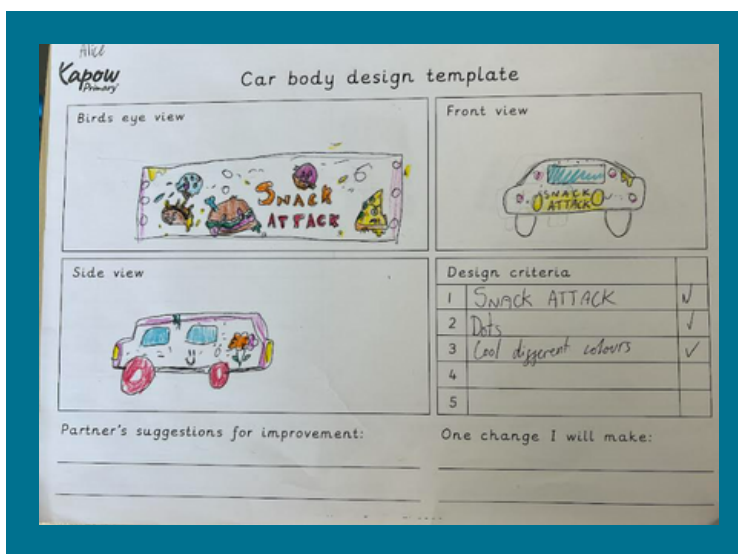

This unit is helping us think carefully about the differences between a play and a narrated story and it has also been helping us with writing with a combination of the present and past tense

In DT we had loads of fun designing what our cars would look like and putting our ideas on paper. We finished the chassis of the car and have taken this home. We are sure that the children will finish putting these together creatively at home and will then be able to bring their finished cars for show and tell!



YEAR 5

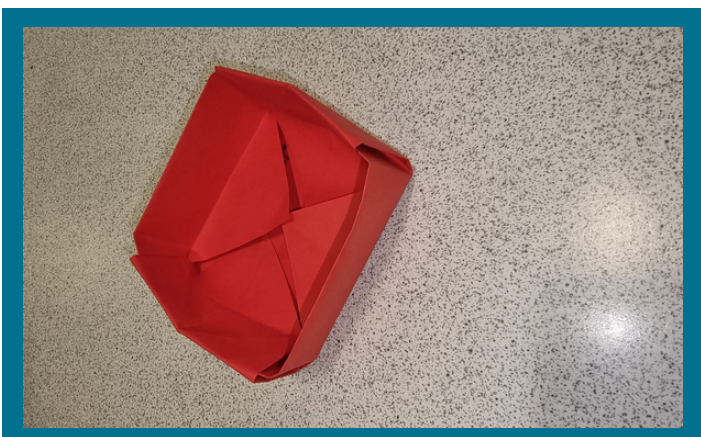
This week in humanities, Year 5 have been planning their humanities essay and all the children are answering the question: 'Humans are not capable of living sustainably.' To what extent do you agree with this statement? Whilst the children are focusing on aspects that we have learned in our topic of sustainability and energy (non-renewable energy, renewable energy, the city of Curitiba and Freiburg), they have been thriving and making sure they are using their literacy skills and embedding their grammar targets such as: colons for a list, fronted adverbials, embedded relative clauses etc. The children always work so hard during the essay writing morning and we cannot wait to see the end result of all of their hard work and dedication!

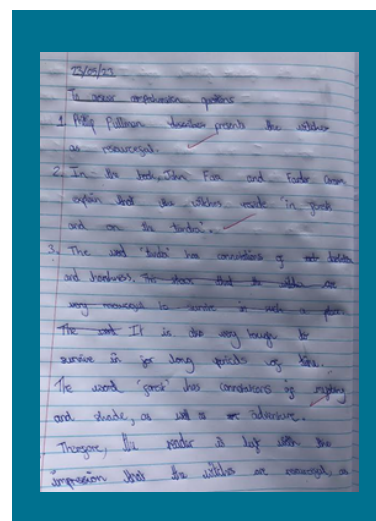
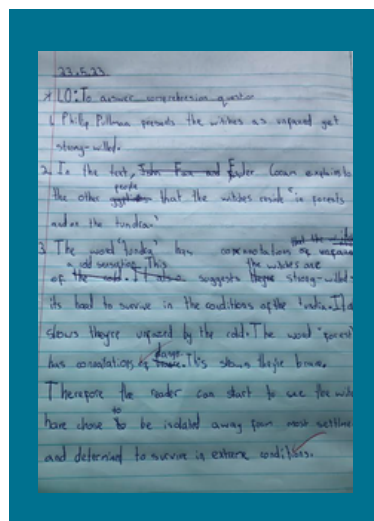
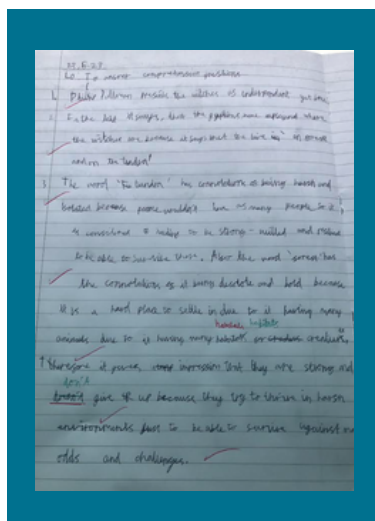
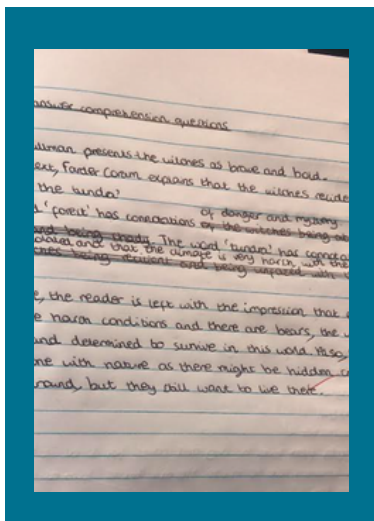


YEAR 6

Thank you to all parents who attended the workshop on Monday 22nd May. We sent out the slides to all parents. If you would like to discuss anything further, please contact a member of the Year 6 team.

In Year 6 this week, we have commenced the transition to prepare our students for life in Year 7. Lots of secondary staff have visited Tyne and Don to introduce themselves and visit our pupils. In their maths lessons, pupils have started a unit on place value to consolidate their knowledge and give them the opportunity to see how lessons are structured in secondary maths, as well as learning how to set their work out in their maths books.

In English lessons, pupils have learned the meaning of the word 'connotation'. A connotation is a linked idea. For example, when we think of the word 'gold' we think of value, success, wealth, excellence and importance. Pupils have been exploring different connotations in Northern Lights and have been learning how to structure a 'What? How? Why?' answer in order to prepare them for their transition to secondary English. This week, pupils thought about what the witches' habitat suggested about their personality and nature. They explored the connotations of forests and the tundra and thought about what the habitat suggested about the witches.

The Young Carers Projects are run by Brentford FC Community Sports Trust, and support young carers between the ages of eight and eighteen who live in the London Boroughs of Ealing and Hounslow.

Young carers are children and young people who look after someone in their family who has an illness, a disability, or is affected by mental ill-health or substance misuse. They will often carry out caring responsibilities usually undertaken by adults, including household chores, physical help, administering medication, shopping, paying bills, providing sibling care or providing emotional support.

The project provides information and advice, fun activities in school holidays, weekly youth clubs, specialist workshops and one to one support. It is also a chance for the young carers to have a break from their caring role and to meet other young carers who are in a similar situation. We aim to make each club a place where young carers can have fun and support each other in a safe environment.

Statutory and Voluntary referrals can be made to the project. Self-Referrals made by the family are also encouraged.
