We have had a great time getting to know each other and making new friends!

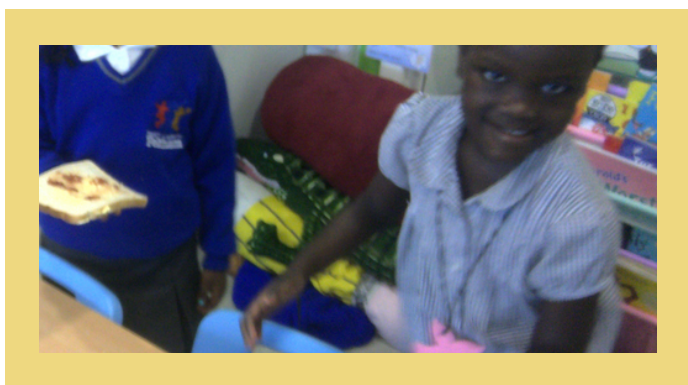

We were so excited to choose new books to read from the school library and have been really responsible at playtime ensuring that we look after our new resources and equipment.

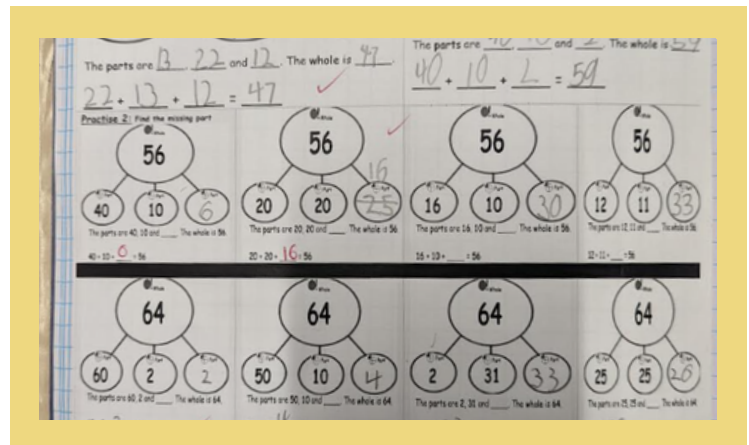
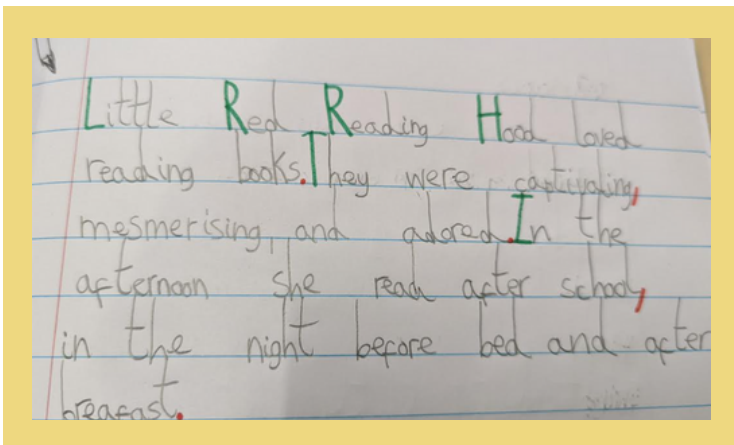
A massive thank you to all of you who were able to attend our Get to Know You Event on Tuesday (13.9.22). We were delighted to get a chance to speak to you and we are very thankful for all of your contributions food wise.

In Literacy, we have been reading a new story called 'Little Red Reading Hood', which is a twist on a well known traditional fairytale. We have started to write our own sentences about the story using some ambitious vocabulary and have experimented with different writing techniques such as alliteration and fronted adverbials to make our sentences more interesting.

In Maths, we have been working on building up our knowledge of numbers within 100, paying close attention to place value. We have represented numbers within this range using a variety of manipulatives including dienes, bead strings and number lines.

In Geography, we have started our unit on Oceans and Seas. We learnt that there are seven continents, with Asia being the largest and Oceania being the smallest. The children learnt that there are five oceans, with the Pacific being the largest.

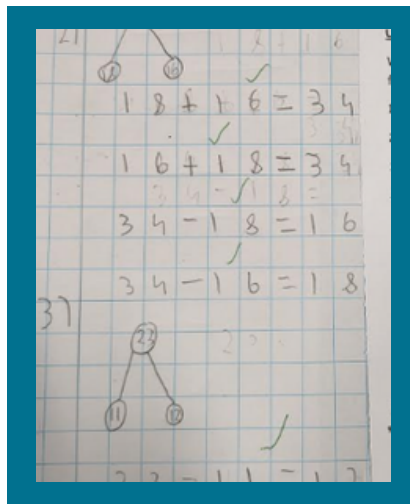
In Science, we began our unit on changing materials. We learnt that materials have different properties and that as a result, they are used for a variety of purposes.



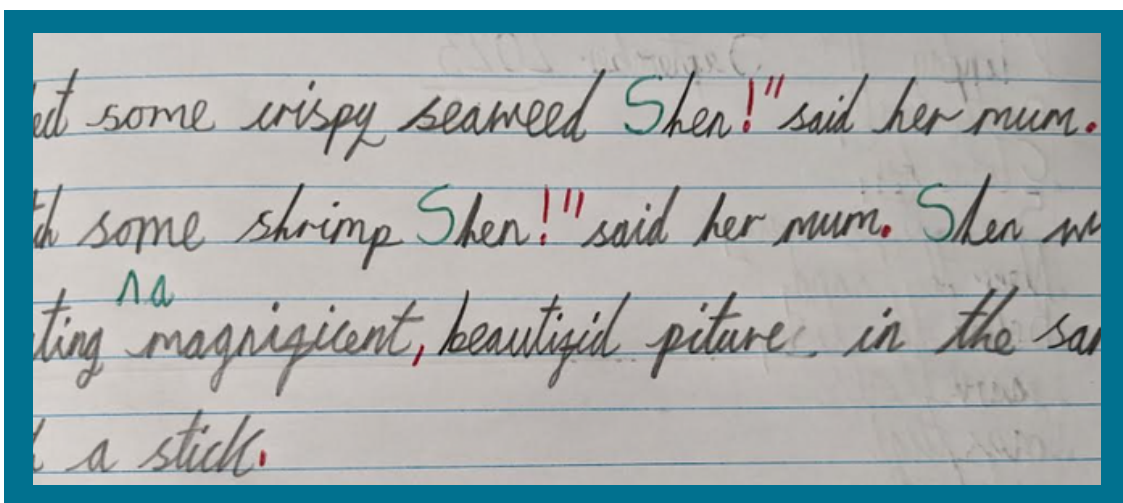
YEAR 3

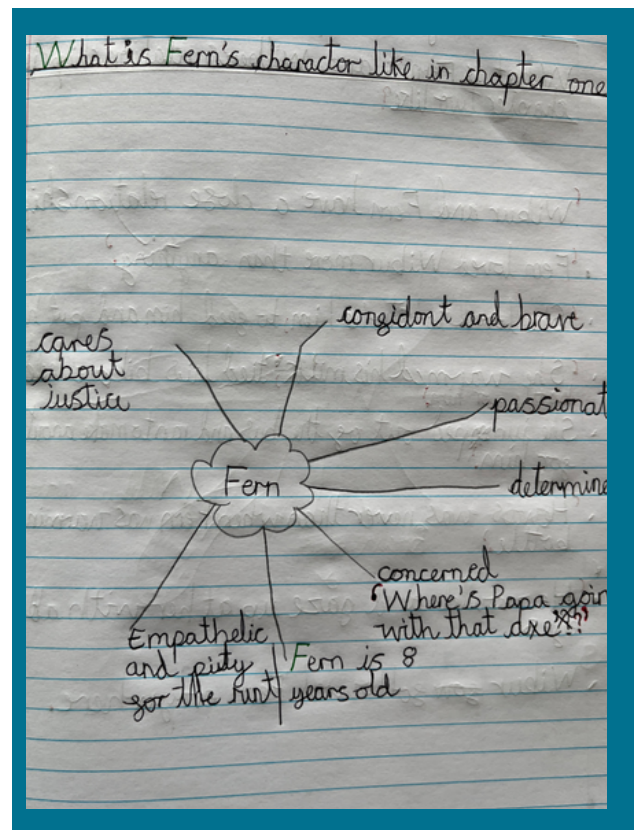
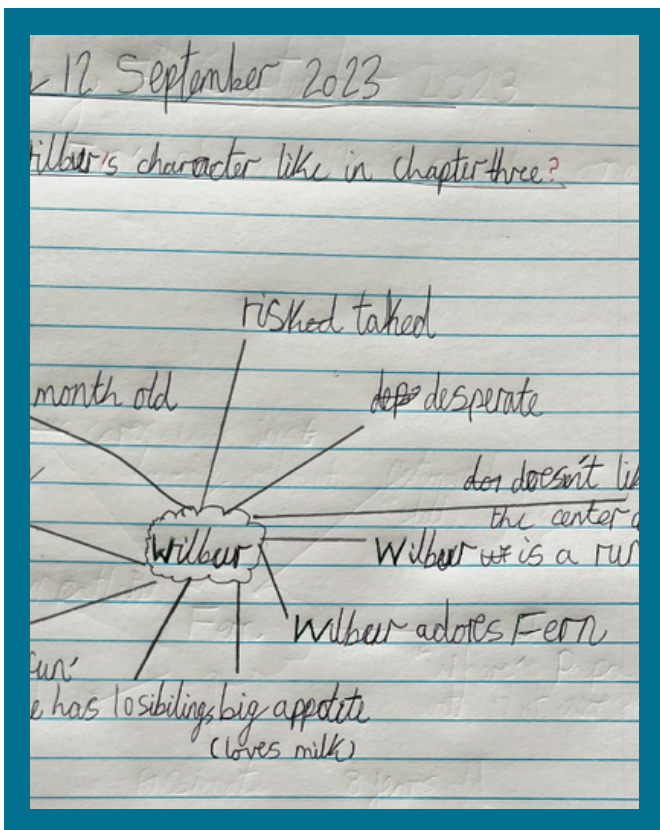


In science, we have started our unit on practical skills and last week the children learnt the 6 key features of a scientific diagram!

YEAR 4

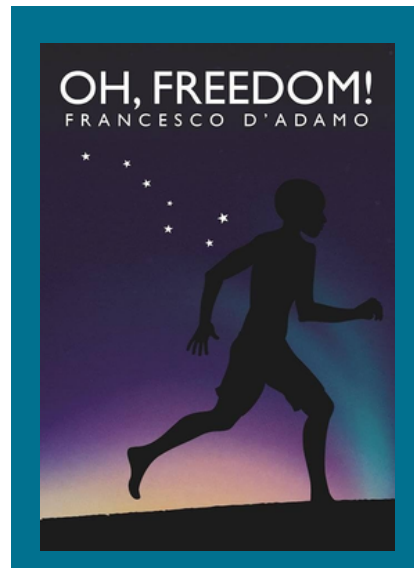

Week 1 & 2

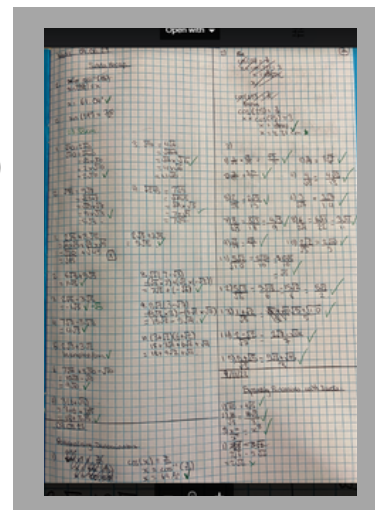

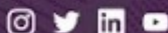

The Young Carers Projects are run by Brentford FC Community Sports Trust, and support young carers between the ages of eight and eighteen who live in the London Boroughs of Ealing and Hounslow.

Young carers are children and young people who look after someone in their family who has an illness, a disability, or is affected by mental ill-health or substance misuse. They will often carry out caring responsibilities usually undertaken by adults, including household chores, physical help, administering medication, shopping, paying bills, providing sibling care or providing emotional support.

The project provides information and advice, fun activities in school holidays, weekly youth clubs, specialist workshops and one to one support. It is also a chance for the young carers to have a break from their caring role and to meet other young carers who are in a similar situation. We aim to make each club a place where young carers can have fun and support each other in a safe environment.

Statutory and Voluntary referrals can be made to the project. Self-Referrals made by the family are also encouraged.
